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

Chairman & Chief Executive Report

We are pleased to report on a particularly strong year for the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs. Having featured in our second Grand Final in three years, there are a number of achievements and positive developments for the Club that we would like to highlight.

On the field, these include:

- The coaching and playing staffs' commitment to innovation and high performance was rewarded with a Grand Final appearance against the Rabbitohs. While not securing the win, the Bulldogs forced Souths to work hard for the victory and the game has already been described as one of the most memorable Grand Finals of the modern era.
- 30 players selected for representative honours across all our age groups, with special mention to be made of NSW Origin debutants Trent Hodkinson and Australian Kangaroos debutants Josh Jackson and David Klemmer.
- The retention of: Tim Lafai, Moses Mbye, Josh Morris, James Graham, Tim Browne, Corey Thompson
- The recruitment of: Michael Lichaa, Curtis Rona, Brett Morris, Antonio Kaufusi
- Growth in junior participation, with over 4000 children now registered as players in the Canterbury-Bankstown Junior Rugby League
- Expanding awareness of the Bulldogs brand by taking 'home' games to Perth and Hamilton NZ.

Off the field the Bulldogs were successful in achieving significant growth in key areas for the business. Each of these will be addressed in greater detail later in this report, however some of the highlights include:

Corporate Partnerships: 100% growth in revenue for the corporate partnership programme thanks to the introduction of new 'inner-sanctum' experiences at games and at the Club. The introduction of digital advertising revenue on bulldogs.com.au and successful club functions and events like the Grand Final Luncheon, NSW State of Origin function and hospitality sales at 'home' matches in Perth and New Zealand.

Digital: An upgraded website and the introduction of new Android and IOS apps were an immediate success and saw the Bulldogs ranking number one across the club network for:

- Page views during May, July and September
- Unique Browsers during April, May, July and September
- Video views during April, May, July and September
- App downloads during April

Just under 1.4 million unique browsers visited Bulldogs digital platforms during the season and amassed over 8 million page views. Bulldogs members & fans consumed over 675,000 video streams through the Bulldogs digital video channel, Bulldogs TV. On Facebook, the Bulldogs surpassed 250,000 likes (251K) and 35,000 followers on Twitter (37K), and for the third year in a row the Bulldogs managed to hold #1 ranking across the club network on Instagram during the season only surpassed by South Sydney after the 2014 Grand Final.



Merchandise: The relocation of the Bulldogs Teamstore to Belmore and the run through to the Grand Final saw merchandise exceed budget targets for 2014. The introduction of two new jersey options – Nines and Women In League – was also an unprecedented success with both options selling out during the year.

Membership: With fans responding to greater flexibility in package options and 'mini' packages, Membership passed the 16,000 mark for the first time - the Club's seventh successive year of growth. Importantly, revenue generated from Membership has grown by 147% in the past five years and it is expected that the introduction of the 'Born and Bred' membership campaign for the 2015 season will see this trajectory continue to rise.

Community: An exceptional year for the Bulldogs in the Community Programme saw Trent Hodkinson win the Ken Stephen Medal for being the most outstanding NRL player working in the community, this was backed up by players dedicating more than 1200 hours to working in the community delivering messages about eating well, staying active and partying safely. The year was capped off with the Prime Minister highlighting the Bulldogs' unique connection with the community to a national audience. The Club's ability to unite people from every race, creed and colour was termed the 'Bulldog Effect' by Mr Tony Abbott as he encouraged others to follow the Bulldogs' lead in promoting respect and tolerance.

Governance: The Board is pleased to welcome Anter Isaac and Steve Mortimer to the Board for the next two years. These two gentlemen bring excellent business skill and extensive network connections to add to the stable Board group who have been in place for the previous rotation.

NRL Review

Whilst not finishing as they would have liked in season 2013, it was a different story in 2014 with the NRL side taking members and fans on a rollercoaster ride that ended with a Grand Final appearance. Whilst falling at the final hurdle to the South Sydney Rabbitohs, there were plenty of positives that came out of the year.

From day one of pre-season you could notice the lift in attitude from the entire squad. With them group knowing that the disappointment of season 2013 could, and would, be used as motivation for season 2014.

Throughout season 2014 the NRL side won 13 games and lost 11, finishing the regular season in seventh position. Finishing in the bottom half of the top eight earned the NRL side a trip to Melbourne for an elimination final against the Storm. In what was one of the most impressive displays of the season, the men from Belmore blew the home side off the park, 28-4. A Semi-Final match against Manly Sea-Eagles was the next hurdle and with that came a thrilling encounter that went to golden-point. After slotting a field goal over in regular time, Trent Hodkinson was again the hero when he took the same option in extra-time to give the Bulldogs an 18-17 victory. A Preliminary Final against western Sydney rivals, Penrith Panthers, was the next challenge, with a Grand Final spot up for grabs. Whilst the scoreboard read 18-12 at the end of 80 minutes, the Bulldogs seemed to be in control from the opening whistle, earning the club a second Grand Final appearance in three years. Whilst valiant in defeat, the Rabbitohs proved too strong for the Bulldogs in the Grand Final, defeating the side, 30-6, at ANZ Stadium. The side were in the match for 55 minutes before the Rabbitohs forward pack took control and ran away with the match.

A total of 27 players were used in season 2014, with a number of players making their NRL or club debut at different stages throughout the season. Corey Thompson, Moses Mbye and Lloyd Perrett all made their first appearance in the top grade, whilst Damien Cook, Pat O'Hanlon and Chase Stanley all wore the blue and white in the NRL for the first time.

While unable to bring home the grand prize, it was a season full of great moments. Some of those included:

- A convincing 42-4 victory in Round 2 against Cronulla Sharks at ANZ Stadium.
- A run of seven victories in a row, from Round 4 Round 10.
- Three one-point victories in a row against Roosters (Rnd 5), Warriors (Rnd 6), Rabbitohs (Rnd 7). The first time it has happened in the history of rugby league.
- A 22-14 victory over the Raiders on a wet and cold Friday night in Canberra. Halves Trent Hodkinson and Josh Reynolds backed-up two days later from a tough State of Origin match.
- As mentioned earlier in the report, the three finals appearances to reach the Grand Final. After the indifferent form at the back end of the season proper, the side lifted for the big occasions.



Special mention must go to all players who gained selection in the various representative sides in 2014. Josh Morris (Australia, NSW), David Klemmer (Australia, City Origin), Josh Jackson (Australia, Country Origin), Greg Eastwood (New Zealand), James Graham (England), Tim Lafai, Reni Maitua, Frank Pritchard, Krisnan Inu (Samoa), Trent Hodkinson, Josh Reynolds, Tony Williams (NSW), Aiden Tolman, Dale Finucane (Country Origin).

A number of players have departed the club at the end of season 2014, we thank them for their service to the club and wish them well for the future. A special mention to Michael Ennis who leaves the club after six years of service and three as captain of the club.

They have been assisting the Executive Committee and steering us in the right direction so that our association is stronger and once again the envy of other districts and codes.

CBDJRL Inc. would not be in existence if not for the financial support given from the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs RLFC. I would like to thank CBDRL for their support, from myself and all participating junior clubs. During April of this year, we had a review carried out at the request of the senior club's Board of Directors. This was conducted by the well-respected Greg Mitchell as an independent consultant looking at reviewing governance and operations of the Junior Club. The items of reference were:

- The governance model
- Are the competitions effectively managed
- Are the clubs happy with the governance and leadership of the competition
- Are there clear and well communicated pathways for players, coaches and referees

As a result of this review, the governing body excelled in ticking those boxes. As with any review, there is always room for improvement and I look forward to implementing these changes in the coming years.

I would like to thank Ray Dib, Raelene Castle and fellow Board Members for their support of the Junior League, also Football Manager Alan Thompson and Development Officer Jim Whitney for their contribution and attendance at meetings.

As in previous years, having our junior players achieve first grade status with the senior club – acknowledgement is due. Congratulations to David Klemmer who was a Chester Hill Hornets junior, for his selection in the Bulldogs first grade side. He also went on to represent City and also Australia in the Kangaroos tour at the end of season 2014.

On what I believe to be of most importance to CBDJRL, is that the 2015 Harold Matthews Cup side shall consist of a minimum of 22 local juniors of the 25 player squad. This shows the high standard of players and coaching within our district. Congratulations to those players and their clubs on their achievements. The effect of all coaches in our association having certifiable qualifications can be seen, and this has had a positive outcome on the skill level of the players.



The behaviour of players, officials and supporters is generally in good sport, but on a downside there are individuals that insist on unruly behaviour that will drive players, officials and supporters from Rugby League. Membership Review

The 2014 season was a challenging one from a Membership perspective, with only small growth in Member numbers, but an increase in Membership revenue and yield.

As well as retaining 65% of 2013 Members, an additional 6,033 new Members were welcomed on board. Income from Memberships totalled \$1.7m (ex GST) for the year.


In 2014 the significant change to the model of reserved seating Memberships made in 2013 was continued, with an additional two bays on the East and West of ANZ Stadium re-categorised as Platinum seating. These changes saw an increase in yield in the reserved seat Memberships.

The popularity of the Platinum Membership decreased slightly with more people leaning towards flexible and mini packages.

Our strategy to continue to grow our interstate and international markets saw a high take up of our ACT, Victorian, Queensland and New Zealand packages. Whilst for the very first time, we proudly had over 200 WA Members join our family.

The program reached 15,203 Members, the first time the 15,000 mark had been reached in the Club's history. This was a 7% increase from 2014 and was the 6th successive year of significant increases. This puts us on a path to aim for 20,000 Members in the near future and to help support the NRL's game-wide strategy of 400,000 Members by 2017.

SEASON REVENUE BY PACKAGE



There has been a 147% increase in Membership revenue generated over the 2010-2014 five year period and we will aim to continue to increase this to be invested back into the Club.

Membership community engagement continues to be a focus for the Club. Member Events ranged from the Members' Christmas Party in December, Member Day in July, Sunday Member after match functions, WA open training and the Queensland Member signing session before our match against the Broncos. In addition, Platinum Plus Members attended a pre-Member Day function and a special State of Origin event viewing experience at Belmore Sports Ground.





The continued strength of the 18 Membership branding was proven by the number of nominations each week for the 18 Member of game jersey presentation. We also were pleased with the large number of Rookie (1st Year Members) nominations.



However the number of Platinum and Gold Members a part of the 35% was proportionately higher in 2014 and something we have already aimed to address for 2015. 2015 will see the introduction of even further flexible packages across all seating categories to ensure that Members can choose a package offering the right number of games to suit their lifestyle.

EVOLVING FOR THE FUTURE

After significant planning Canterbury is set to commence the largest development ever undertaken at the Club. The entire project is expected to take approximately three and a half to four years to complete and will be staged to ensure that there is minimal disruption to Members & Guests. Following is an overview of the development.

ARRIVE IN COMFORT

The first stage of the official redevelopment is expected to commence in early March with works focussing on excavating and building the new 450 space underground car park at the front of the Club.

BUILDING A FOUNDATION FOR THE FUTURE

To ensure that Canterbury can deliver not only this project but future projects, it is necessary to upgrade the Club's ageing infrastructure. Work will include the construction of a large central underground loading dock, the construction of a large underground production kitchen and a smaller production kitchen under Flame Pizza + Grill.

AN ICONIC DINING DESTINATION

One of the major focusses of the development is the improvement of the Club's dining offering for Members. This will include the construction of new outlets as well as an expansion of some of our existing restaurants.

A new 24 hour casual dining restaurant will be constructed on the ground floor of the Northern Wing of the Club between reception and Flame Pizza + Grill. This restaurant will serve a range of cook to order meals and will seat approximately 200 people in a mixture of internal, outdoor and lounge seating areas. This restaurant will also act as the Club's main café offering.

ENTERTAINMENT FOR EVERYONE

Canterbury's commitment to provide quality entertainment to Members will be reaffirmed with the construction of a new showroom on level 1. The new showroom will be designed to provide a number of seating configurations such as table and theatre style and will have approximately twice the capacity of the existing Paragon Room. This will enable the Club to attract higher calibre performers than we are presently able to with our small capacity room.

ENJOY THE COMPANY OF FRIENDS & FAMILY

One of the areas missing from Canterbury in recent years is a main central bar and lounge for Members to meet up over a drink or two and enjoy some casual entertainment. With the construction of a new purpose built show room on level 1, the existing Paragon Room will be opened up and converted into a new lounge and bar, with a new outdoor area to be constructed at the end of the room. Above the new 24 hour casual dining restaurant, an intimate new 'cocktail' style bar will be built. This exclusive and stylish space will have small internal and outdoor lounges with a range of premium beverages.

The overall success of the Corporate Partnership program is bolstered by the ongoing support of the corporate community. Over 128 businesses partnered with the Bulldogs Corporate Partnership network in 2014, in addition to our Major Sponsors, and were part of a season that saw the Club contest its second Grand Final in three seasons.

2014 saw continued growth of the program, with a 43% increase in revenue recorded since 2012. This continued expansion has resulted in an average corporate attendance at Bulldogs home matches increasing to over 800 guests per match across the club's six match day facilities. The Players Club, 50m Line Club and Private Suite packages were sold out prior to the commencement of the season.

Our Corporate event numbers also continue to grow, and due to the overwhelming popularity of our annual community golf day, two tee-off times were scheduled and sold out. New South Wales concluded eight years of dominance in the State of Origin by Queensland, and the club hosted a record 610 clients at our Game 2 function held at Allphones Arena. The Bulldogs annual Grand Final function was boosted by the on-field success of our team, and over 590 corporate guests attended our Grand Final function.

With the overall department growth, the Bulldogs now boast the most comprehensive partnership department in the NRL. The Corporate team now consists of seven full-time staff who are dedicated to providing our partners with quality match day and networking experiences throughout the season.





Bulldogs most watched in 2014

2014 was a successful year on the field for the Canterbury-Bankstown club with the NRL side finishing as runnersup after a Grand Final loss to the Rabbitohs, but it was also off the field where the Bulldogs business was kicking goals.

A report released late last year from Repucom showed that the Bulldogs were the second most watched sporting team in Australia, across the four football sporting codes (NRL, AFL, A-League & Super 15s). The sporting team who came in first place was the Hawthorn Hawks, who play in the AFL competition.

In total, close to 25 million watched the Bulldogs games throughout season 2014 and of those, 23 million watched via 'free to air' television broadcasts. This figure was by far the highest of all the teams competing amongst the four codes.

The Bulldogs Sponsorship team are focused on delivering strong results for our valued partners, on the back of the record television audience the Bulldogs received, our major sponsors also enjoyed a record amount of brand exposure over free-to-air television, pay television, print media and digital channels.

Bulldogs major sponsor Jaycar Electronics received the most television exposure of all major sponsors across all four codes, and were the only NRL sponsor featured in the top five. While apparel partner, Canterbury Clothing, received the third highest amount of exposure among NRL teams.







Bulldogs in the Community enjoyed another strong year in 2014, donating over \$100,000 to community and charitable organisations. Bulldogs players, Sapphires and staff gave over 1,200 hours of their time interacting with the community and provided more than 1,800 "money can't buy" game day and training experiences to special guests and supporters who have fallen on hard times.

HODKINSON KICKS PERSONAL GOAL

Trent Hodkinson made his mark as a community ambassador this year with the launch of his kicking tee initiative. Dedicating his kicking tee each game to a worthy recipient, Trent presented 22 people in need with their personalised tee and a signed photo to lift their spirits. This initiative, along with his dedicated support of the RSPCA, saw Trent awarded the Ken Stephen Medal for his outstanding contribution to the community.

IT AIN'T WEAK TO SPEAK

Bulldogs in the Community extended its mental health awareness program by joining the PPP4SPA fundraiser in aid of Suicide Prevention Australia. Bulldogs players, Sapphires and staff attended the PPP4SPA event in Maroubra before holding our own treadmill run for the duration of the Round 17 game against Manly. In the local community, the Bulldogs proudly launched our local council's "Canterbury Cares" mental health awareness month and players Josh Jackson, Dale Finucane and Reni Maitua continued their great ambassador work promoting the message that "it's not weak to speak". In 2014, the Bulldogs contributed close to \$30,000 to beyondblue and Suicide Prevention Australia.

BULLDOGS IN HARMONY

The Bulldogs celebrated our culturally diverse community in 2014 with the commencement of the "In League In Harmony" (ILIH) program in Canterbury-Bankstown district schools. Delivered in conjunction with the NRL, the seven week social inclusion program engaged students through the game of rugby league and delivered the core message of acknowledging and appreciating the cultural similarities and differences that exist in schools and the wider community. At the conclusion of the program, participating schools formed teams to play league tag at the ILIH Festival and had the opportunity to play against former players such as Bulldogs legend Hazem El-Masri. Two students from each school were then announced as ILIH ambassadors and invited to the NRL to participate in a leadership workshop.

Kim was joined by members of Waikato Bay of Plenty Magic netball team and the Auckland Warriors. Money raised during the event was donated to the Te Whakaruruhau Women's Refuge.

BULLDOGS HOST MINI SPECIAL OLYMPICS

The second annual Bulldogs Mini Special Olympics held at Belmore Sports Ground, with Special Olympic athletes invited to compete in teams alongside Buildogs players and staff. The events of relay, obstacle course, bowls and pass the ball were fiercely contested and enjoyed by all. Young Special Olympian Oscar stole everyone's hearts and won the honour of tossing the coin before the Round 25 clash against the Rabbitohs.

WORKING TOGETHER

Bulldogs in the Community teamed up with Bulldogs corporate partners to extend a helping hand to those in need. Gary Johnston of Jaycar displayed enormous generosity once again, donating \$75,000 towards the Rise 4 Alex Foundation and to assist in the rehabilitation of Bulldogs supporter Curtis Landers, who suffered a devastating spinal injury playing league. The Bulldogs also joined in the support of Rise 4 Alex, with Trent Hodkinson dedicating his kicking tee to the cause and donating it to the foundation for auction. Curtis Landers and his family were invited by the Bulldogs to join us at VIP guests at a number of our games throughout the season.

Sponsors M&J Chickens also showed their community spirit, joining Bulldogs in the Community to construct a vegetable garden for Riverwood Public School as part of M&J Chicken's "Healthy Lifestyle competition". Special Olympics Australia also benefited from M&J Chickens' generosity, with the donation of advertising space for the Special Olympics Cup during the Round 25 clash against the Rabbitohs.

In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$10 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter. Total amount that members are liable as at 31 October 2014 is \$10,680 (2013: \$9,860).

7 Likely future developments

During the forthcoming year, the consolidated entity will continued to redevelop the Belmore premises in accordance with its Masterplan. The consolidated entity will also complete the sale of the Earlwood site land and buildings and the deamalgamation of the Bay Sports Club.

Notes to the financial statements

1 REPORTING ENTITY

Bulldogs Rugby League Club Limited (the Company) is a company incorporated and domiciled in Australia. The consolidated financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended 31 October 2014 comprise the Company and its controlled entity (together referred to as the 'consolidated entity' and individually as 'Group entity').

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and without share capital. In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$10 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter.

The consolidated entity is a not-for-profit entity and is primarily involved in the operation of registered clubs and the promotion of rugby league.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

(a) Statement of compliance

In the opinion of the directors, the consolidated entity and the Company are not publicly accountable. The financial statements of the consolidated entity and the Company are Tier 2 general purpose financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements (AASB-RDRs) adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Corporations Act 2001. These financial statements comply with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements.

ASIC Class Order 10/654 Inclusion of parent entity financial statements in financial reports has been applied to permit the inclusion of parent entity financial statements in this consolidated financial report.

The financial statements were approved by the Board of Directors on 16th December 2014.

(b) Basis of measurement

These consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for investment property which is measured at fair value.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

These consolidated financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is also the Company's functional currency.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION (continued)

(d) Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

Information about assumptions and estimation uncertainties that have a significant risk of resulting in a material adjustment within the next financial year are included in the following notes:

- Note 8 Discontinued operations
- Note 12 Investment properties
- Note 13 Assets classified as held for sale
- Note 15 Property, plant and equipment

- Note 18 Trade and other payables
- Note 21 Business combination

(e) Changes in accounting policies

Short-term employee benefits

The Company has adopted AASB119 Employee Benefits (2011) with a date of initial application of 1 November 2013.

As a result of AASB119 (2011), the Company has changed its accounting policy with respect to the definition of short-term employee benefits. The amended AASB119 (2011) defines the short-term benefits as benefits that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. It was previously defined as those due to be settled within 12 months after the end of the period in which employees render the related service. This change may result in benefits previously classified as short-term being treated as other long-term employee benefits and measured on a discounted basis.

The Company assessed its short-term employee benefits on adoption of the revised standard and noted it to have no material impact to the Company's financial statements.

AASB 13 Fair Value Measurement

AASB 13 provides a single source of guidance on how fair value is measured, and replaces the fair value measurement guidance that is currently dispersed throughout Australian Accounting Standards. Subject to limited exceptions, AASB 13 is applied when fair value measurements or disclosures are required or permitted by other AASBs. There has not been any material changes as a result of adopting this new standard.

(f) Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis of accounting, which assumes the continuity of normal business activities and the realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities in the ordinary course of business.

The Company has reported a net working capital deficiency of \$1,158,688 (2013: \$1,864,427). Notwithstanding the above, the directors believe the going concern assumption is appropriate given:



(f) Going concern (continued)

• The Canterbury League Club Limited has committed grant funding for the year ending 31 October 2015 of \$5,000,000;

• In addition to the committed funding above, the Canterbury League Club Limited has undertaken to continue to provide such financial and other support as necessary (including grants or loans) to the Company for at least the next twelve months from the date of approval of the Company's financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2014 to enable the Company to continue to trade and to meet its financial obligations and be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable.

After considering the above, the directors consider that the Company will be able to continue to fulfil all obligations as and when they fall due for the foreseeable future, being at least one year from the date of approval of these financial statements, and accordingly, that the Company's financial statements should be prepared on a going concern basis.

Accordingly, no adjustment has been made to the financial report relating to the recoverability and classification of recorded asset amounts or to the amounts and classification of liabilities that might be necessary should the Company not continue as a going concern.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these consolidated financial statements, and have been applied consistently by the consolidated entity and the Company.

(a) Basis of consolidation

(i) Subsidiaries

Subsidiaries are entities controlled by the consolidated entity. Control exists when the consolidated entity has the power to govern the financial and operating policies of an entity so as to obtain benefits from its activities. In assessing control, potential voting rights that currently are exercisable are taken into account. The financial statements of subsidiaries are included in the consolidated financial statements from the date that control commences until the date that control ceases. The accounting policies of subsidiaries have been changed when necessary to align them with the policies adopted by the consolidated entity.

(ii) Transactions eliminated on consolidation

Intra-group balances, and any unrealised income and expenses arising from intra-group transactions, are eliminated in preparing the consolidated financial statements.

(iii) Amalgamation reserve

An amalgamation reserve in members' funds is utilised for amalgamations with other registered clubs. The amount presented is equal to the fair value of the net assets of the club acquired. The individual assets and liabilities acquired are presented in the consolidated statement of financial position. This policy is effective for amalgamations occurring after 1 November 2010.

(b) Financial instruments

(i) Non-derivative financial assets

Financial assets are recognised initially on the date at which the consolidated entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

The consolidated entity derecognises a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire, or it transfers the rights to receive the contractual cash flows on the financial asset in a transaction in which substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset are transferred. Any interest in transferred financial assets that is created or retained by the consolidated entity is recognised as a separate asset or liability.

The consolidated entity has the following categories of non-derivative financial assets: loans and receivables.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(b) Financial instruments (continued)

(i) Non-derivative financial assets (continued)

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses (see note 3(h)).

Loans and receivables comprise cash and trade and other receivables and call deposits with maturities greater than three months from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits with maturities of three months or less from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value, and are used by the consolidated entity in the management of its short-term commitments.

(ii) Non-derivative financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are recognised initially on the date at which the consolidated entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. The consolidated entity derecognises a financial liability when its contractual obligations are discharged, cancelled or expire.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount presented in the statement of financial position when, and only when, the consolidated entity has a legal right to offset the amounts and intends either to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

The consolidated entity has the following categories of non-derivative financial liabilities: other financial liabilities.

Other financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value plus any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition these financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Other financial liabilities comprise bank overdrafts, loans and borrowings and trade and other payables.

Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the consolidated entity's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

(i) Recognition and measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. Purchased software that is integral to the functionality of the related equipment is capitalised as part of that equipment.

When parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Any gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment (calculated as the difference between the net proceeds from disposal and the carrying amount of the item) is recognised in profit or loss.



(c) Property, plant and equipment (continued)

(ii) Subsequent costs

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the consolidated entity. Ongoing repairs and maintenance are expensed as incurred.

(iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated over the depreciable amount, which is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its residual value.

Depreciation is recognised in profit or loss over the estimated useful lives of each part of an item of property, plant and equipment, since this most closely reflects the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the asset. Leased assets are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives unless it is reasonably certain that the consolidated entity will obtain ownership by the end of the lease term. Land is not depreciated.

Depreciation methods, useful lives and residual values are reviewed at each financial year-end and adjusted if appropriate.

(d) Intangible assets

Poker machine entitlements

Poker machine entitlements have infinite useful lives given they have no expiry date. They are measured at cost less accumulated impairment losses.

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only when it increases the future economic benefits embodied in the specific asset to which it relates. All other expenditure is recognised in profit or loss as incurred.

(e) Investment property

Investment property is property held either to earn rental income or for capital appreciation or for both, but not for sale in the ordinary course of business, use in the production or supply of goods or services or for administrative purposes. Investment property is measured at cost on initial recognition and subsequently at fair value with any change therein recognised in profit or loss. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the investment property.

When the use of a property changes such that it is reclassified as property, plant and equipment, its fair value at the date of reclassification becomes its cost for subsequent accounting.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(f) Leased assets

Leases in terms of which the consolidated entity assumes substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership are classified as finance leases. Upon initial recognition the leased asset is measured at an amount equal to the lower of its fair value and the present value of the minimum lease payments. Subsequent to initial recognition, the asset is accounted for in accordance with the accounting policy applicable to that asset.

Other leases are classified as operating leases and the leased assets are not recognised in the consolidated entity's statement of financial position.

(g) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of inventories is based on the firstin first-out principle, and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and other costs incurred in bringing them to their existing location and condition.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and selling expenses.

(h) Impairment

(i) Financial assets

A financial asset not carried at fair value through profit or loss is assessed at each reporting date to determine whether there is objective evidence that it is impaired. A financial asset is impaired if objective evidence indicates that a loss event has occurred after the initial recognition of the asset, and that the loss event had a negative effect on the estimated future cash flows of that asset that can be estimated reliably.

Objective evidence that financial assets are impaired can include default or delinquency by a debtor, restructuring of an amount due to the consolidated entity on terms that the consolidated entity would not consider otherwise, indications that a debtor or issuer will enter bankruptcy, economic conditions that correlate with defaults.

The consolidated entity considers evidence of impairment for receivables at both a specific asset and collective level. All individually significant receivables are assessed for specific impairment. All individually significant receivables found not to be specifically impaired are then collectively assessed for any impairment that has been incurred but not yet identified.

An impairment loss in respect of a financial asset measured at amortised cost is calculated as the difference between its carrying amount and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. Losses are recognised in profit or loss and reflected in an allowance account against receivables. Interest on the impaired asset continues to be recognised through the unwinding of the discount. When a subsequent event causes the amount of impairment loss to decrease, the decrease in impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss.

(ii) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of the consolidated entity's non-financial assets, other than investment property, inventories and deferred tax assets, are reviewed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, then the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. Indefinite live intangible assets are tested annually for impairment.



(h) Impairment (continued)

(ii) Non-financial assets (continued)

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the greater of its fair value less costs to sell and value in use, being the depreciated replacement cost of the asset. For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or groups of assets (a "cash-generating unit" or "CGU").

An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or its CGU exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised in profit or loss. Impairment losses recognised in respect of CGUs are allocated to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the unit (group of units) on a pro rata basis.

Impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at each reporting date for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount. An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, if no impairment loss had been recognised.

(i) Non-current assets held for sale

Non-current assets that are expected to be recovered primarily through sale rather than through continuing use are classified as held for sale. Immediately before classification as held for sale, the assets are remeasured in accordance with the consolidated entity's accounting policies. Thereafter generally the assets are measured at the lower of their carrying amount and fair value less cost to sell.

Impairment losses on initial classification as held for sale and subsequent gains or losses on remeasurement are recognised in profit or loss. Gains are not recognised in excess of any cumulative impairment loss.

Once classified as held for sale, intangible assets and property, plant and equipment are not amortised or depreciated.

(j) Employee benefits

(i) Defined contribution plans

A defined contribution plan is a post-employment benefit plan under which an entity pays fixed contributions into a separate entity and will have no legal or constructive obligation to pay further amounts. Obligations for contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an employee benefit expense in profit or loss in the periods during which services are rendered by employees.

(ii) Other long-term employee benefits

The consolidated entity's net obligation in respect of long-term employee benefits other than defined benefit plans is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods plus related on-costs; that benefit is discounted to determine its present value, and the fair value of any related assets is deducted. The discount rate is the yield at the reporting date on government bonds that have maturity dates approximating the terms of the consolidated entity's obligations.

(iii) Short-term benefits

Short-term employee benefit obligations are measured on an undiscounted basis and are expensed as the related service is provided.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(k) Provisions

A provision is recognised if, as a result of a past event, the consolidated entity has a present legal or constructive obligation that can be estimated reliably, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows at a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the liability.

The consolidated entity operates a loyalty program where customers accumulate points for dollars spent. The provision represents the current estimate of future cash outflows that will result from future redemption of unredeemed points as at year end.

Make good provision

In accordance with the consolidated entity's leases of premises, the consolidated entity must restore leased premises to their original condition. Because of the long-term nature of the liability, the greatest uncertainty in estimating the provision is the costs that will ultimately be incurred.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the make good obligation at the reporting date, based on current market conditions. Future restoration costs are reviewed annually and any changes are reflected in the present value of the make good provision at the end of the reporting period.

(I) Revenue

Goods sold and services rendered

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of food, beverage and other goods, and is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services rendered comprises revenue from gaming facilities together with other services provided to members and patrons of the consolidated entity, and is recognised through profit or loss when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due or the reliable measurement of costs incurred or to be incurred, there is risk of return of goods or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

Commissions

When the consolidated entity acts in the capacity of an agent rather than as the principal in a transaction, the revenue recognised is the net amount of commission made by the consolidated entity. *Grant revenue*

Grants are recognised as income when there is reasonable assurance they will be received by the Company and the Company has complied with the conditions associated with the grant.

(m) Lease payments

Payments made under operating leases are recognised in profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives received are recognised as an integral part of the total lease expense, over the term of the lease.

Minimum lease payments made under finance leases are apportioned between the finance expense and the reduction of the outstanding liability. The finance expense is allocated to each period during the lease term so as to produce a constant periodic rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability.

(n) Finance income and finance costs

Finance income comprises interest income on cash and cash equivalents. Interest income is recognised as it accrues in profit or loss, using the effective interest method.

Finance costs comprise interest expense on loans and borrowings. Borrowing costs that are not directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or productions of a qualifying asset are recognised in profit or loss using the effective interest method.



(o) Tax

(i) Company

The Company is exempt from income tax under Taxation Ruling 97/22 as the Bulldogs Rugby League Club Limited is regarded as being established for the encouragement of a game and sport.

(ii) Consolidated entity

(a) Current tax

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

(b) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation purposes.

The measurement of deferred tax reflects the tax consequences that could follow the manner in which the consolidated entity expects, at the end of the reporting period, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to temporary differences when they reverse, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if there is a legally enforceable right to offset current tax liabilities and assets, and they relate to income taxes levied by the same tax authority on the same taxable entity, or on different tax entities, but they intend to settle current tax liabilities and assets on a net basis or their tax assets and liabilities will be realised simultaneously.

A deferred tax asset is recognised for unused tax losses, tax credits and deductible temporary differences, to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which they can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

(c) Tax exposure

In determining the amount of current and deferred tax the consolidated entity takes into account the impact of uncertain tax positions and whether additional taxes and interest may be due. This assessment relies on estimates and assumptions and may involve a series of judgements about future events. New information may become available that causes the consolidated entity to change its judgement regarding the adequacy of existing tax liabilities; such changes to tax liabilities will impact tax expense in the period that such a determination is made.

(p) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is included as a current asset or liability in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

8 DISCONTINUED OPERATIONS

"On 11 November 2013, the consolidated entity committed to a plan and called for expressions of interest for an amalgamation partner for its premises at Bateau Bay, The Bay Sports Club. Accordingly, the assets and liabilities to be transferred on the de-amalgamation has been presented as a disposal group held for sale at 31 October 2014. An offer of \$6,000,000 was received and accepted by the consolidated entity for the land, buildings, plant, equipment, gaming machine entitlements and employee benefits prior to year end. Costs to sell were estimated at \$500,000, which has been taken into account when valuing assets classified as Assets held for sale.

The consolidated enitty has also committed to a plan to sell the land and buildings at the Earlwood premises. On 29 June 2014 the club at the Earlwood premises ceased trading, the club's licence de-activated and all gaming machine entitlements transferred to other premises run by the consolidated entity. On 30 October 2014 the consolidated entity received and accepted a \$4,000,000 offer for the sale of 32 Fricourt Avenue. Management have also obtained a market appraisal from an external real estate agent for the remaining two lots at 7-9 Kitchener Avenue, which are to be auctioned in December 2014. Costs to sell were estimated at \$50,000, which has been taken into account when valuing assets classified as Assets held for sale.

Impairment losses of \$6,166,727 for write-downs of the disposal groups to the lower of their carrying amount and their fair value less costs to sell have been included in Impairment expense below. The Bay Sports Club and Earlwood premises were not previously classified as held-for-sale or as a discontinued operation. The comparative statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income has been restated to show the discontinued operation separately from continuing operations.
